29th – 30th August 2009

Kingsbury Waterpark, Bodymoor Heath, Warwickshire, England



1 ORGANISATION

The European JT250 Championships and a round of the European Formula OSY400 Championships are to be held at Kingsbury Waterpark, Bodymoor Heath, Warwickshire, England on the 29th and 30th August 2009. The Championships are organized by the Midlands Powerboat Racing Club in accordance with:

- A) Regulations of the U.I.M.
- B) Regulations of the R.Y.A.
- C) These Advance Regulations
- D) Supplementary regulations that may be issued

2 DEFINITION OF THE RACE

The race takes place on a 3 buoy circuit of 1100m per lap. All heats will be run in an anti-clockwise direction. The best three heats of each driver will be chosen for the results.

JT250	4 heats of 6 laps
Formula OSY400	4 heats of 6 laps.

3 ENTRIES

All entries must be on an official entry form and authorized by the drivers national authority. Entries to reach the organising club by **14th August 2009**. Late entries will be accepted subject to documentation being in order.

4 INSURANCE

All drivers must have third party indemnity of £5,000,000 (Five Million Pounds) on water cover and £10,000,000 (Ten Million Pounds) on land cover. Any driver not having full cover may purchase insurance at a cost of 40 Euro (U.I.M. rule 205.09).

In the event that a third party claim is made against the club's RYA insurance policy the driver involved shall be liable for payment of the £1000 (One Thousand Pounds) premium excess.

A: ADMINISTRATIVE REGISTRATION

Registration will take place in the race office and drivers must personally submit:
International Drivers licence valid for 2009.
Valid Insurance cover.

B. TECHNICAL REGISTRATION

Valid measurement certificate.

All boats must have a technical inspection prior to any training or racing. Any boat involved in an incident **MUST** be REINSPECTED.

C. EQUIPMENT

Valid measurement certificate must be produced.

Life Jacket U.I.M Rule 205.06

Cut resistant U.I.M Rule 205.11

Paddle

Every driver is required to fix a sticker of the event sponsor in a good visible position on the left and right sides of the boat during the whole event.

11 PROPELLER GUARD

It is forbidden to start an engine with the propeller unshielded unless immediately prior to launch (30 seconds [dead engines] on jetty).

12 ENGINE MEASURING AND SEALING/TECHNICAL INSPECTION

All engines will be sealed after training, any broken seal not authorised by the technical officer will deem the driver disqualified.

Post race inspection of the first three boats will be undertaken: Any refusal will deem the engine to be illegal.

Boats may be weighed by the Technical Inspector at any time.

13 RACE NUMBERS

The race numbers are given by the Race Committee, the usual number of the driver may be changed in the case of similarity. These starting numbers must correspond with UIM regulations with regards to type and size. Boats that do not carry the correct size numbers will not be classified. U.I.M Rule 206.02

14 FUEL

Fuel to be purchased at the following TOTAL service station, directions to the service station are shown below:

Drayton Service Station, Watling Street, Fazeley, Staffordshire, B78 3RL.

Fuel testing will be carried out in accordance with UIM Rules. U.I.M Rule 508

15 STARTS

Jetty Starts – U.I.M Rule 307. Late start buoy will be used.

16 RE-STARTS

There will be one re-start. In the final heat there shall be a second re-start if the first restarted final heat is stopped before 35% of the required laps have been completed. U.I.M 311.02

17 END OF RACE

The end of the race is signalled to the driver by a black and white chequered flag. U.I.M Rule 317.02

To gain points a driver must take the chequered flag and have completed 75% of the race distance.
U.I.M Rule 318.02

18 RACE STOPPED

A race may be stopped by the officer of the day. U.I.M Rule 311

19 PENALTIES

In accordance with U.I.M Rules.

20 SIGNAL FLAGS

These will be used in accordance with U.I.M Rule 304.02

21 PROTESTS

Protests will be dealt with in accordance with U.I.M regulations.

U.I.M Rule 403

Protest forms will be available from the race secretary, and must be accompanied by the correct fee of £75 (Seventy Five Pounds).

22 THE JURY

The jury will be announced at driver's meeting. U.I.M Rule 402.01/402.2

23 POINTS SYSTEM

25% drop – 400 – 300 – 225 etc. U.I.M Rule 318.01

24 PIT AREA

No vehicles or camping will be allowed to remain in the pit area. **SMOKING IS PROHIBITED.** No naked flames, grills or BBQs allowed in the pit area. All competitors will be allocated a 3m x 4m pit space. The pits will be closed between 22:00 and 09:00

25 PIT CONTROL

All instructions given by the pit marshal are mandatory.

26 POLLUTION

Oil and spillage mats are mandatory.

27 UNOFFICIAL TRAINING

Any training outside the designated training sessions will be classed as a danger and the driver will be disqualified.

28 ALCOHOL

The organisers reserve the right to breathalyse all persons in the pit area at any time during the duration of the race meeting to test for alcohol (U.I.M Rule 205.02.02). If alcohol level is higher than permissible the person concerned will be expelled from the pit area and the driver from this person's team will be disqualified.

29 DOPING

The organiser reserves the right to carry out doping tests in accordance with U.I.M Rule 205.02.03

30 GROSS MISCONDUCT

Any driver found guilty of unacceptable behaviour will be penalised. U.I.M Rule 406.03

31 LIABILITIES

Whilst every precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of persons, craft and property, the organisers **DO NOT** accept responsibility for any accident, damage or loss arising from the meeting.

32 DRIVERS MEETING

The official drivers meeting will take place in the clubhouse at 9.00am on Saturday 29th August 2009.

33 BUOYS

Damaged boys will be charged at £80

34 PRIZE GIVING

This will take place at Midlands Powerboat Racing Club as soon as possible after completion of racing. Trophies will be given to the first three places, in addition gold silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the first three places in the JT250 European Championship.

35 TRAVEL MONEY

For Class OSY400 100 Euro travel money will be paid to each foreign driver. UIM Rule 108.02

36 NOTICES

The organisers reserve the right to enforce any rule or condition which may be imposed upon them by the local authorities.






Travel on M42 North to Jnc 9 (approx 5km).


At roundabout take 4th exit Kingsbury Road A4097.
